RE: Vishay's successful know-your-customer and due diligence policies.

Dear Mr. Smejkal,

We write to you as [B4Ukraine](#), a coalition of Ukrainian and international civil society organizations working to curtail the financial resources enabling the Russian invasion of Ukraine. We would like to openly discuss the measures that Vishay Intertechnology has taken to successfully avoid support of the Russian war machine.

The Russian military, although hampered by Ukrainian resistance, Western sanctions and Western support, continues to function. A significant amount of Russian ammunition, drones and other military equipment are made using imported components. In September 2022, POLITICO reported on a Russian "shopping list" of components the Kremlin had identified as needing to sustain its war effort, including one component classified as "Priority 2 / important" and thirteen components classified as "Priority 3 / low importance" made by Vishay.<sup>1</sup>

Russia has been able to exploit different circumvention schemes to continue importing components, including from the majority of the companies listed on the "shopping list". However, our internal research shows that Vishay's components have not been found or reported in Russian weapons used in Ukraine. This is a significant accomplishment and an outlier in the technology and microchips industry.

B4Ukraine works with an extensive network of supply chain and due diligence specialists to identify and promote best practices among corporations to limit Russia's ability to maintain and repair its military. We would very much welcome the opportunity to go over the matter with you and discuss what our team, as well as other companies, could learn from Vishay and its know-your-customer and due diligence policies.
